Mangalayatan University has started 'GATE-Crack' training for Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering (GATE) two years back. This facility is available free of cost for 3rd and 4th Year B.Tech students of MU in addition to regular study.

According to Prof. Mantha, 'GATE has become a gateway for Public Sector Companies and PG courses in prestigious courses. Every engineering

graduate has a dream to crack it. Faculty from IET has taken this as a challenge and we decided to impart education according to the syllabus of GATE. Highly qualified faculty from IIT, Roorkee, BHU IT, Varanasi, IIIT and MNNIT Allahabad are imparting training to the students. They all are GATE qualified and are helping students to understand the basics of GATE.

Shri Karthik Gopalan, Vice-President (Operations) has said that this facility is an additional effort by the faculty to facilitate students for PSU jobs and preparing them for prestigious PG courses. 'It is very hard to get the admission or job in Maharatna, Navaratna companies without qualifying GATE. This program 'GATE-Crack' is designed to give student interactivity, convenience and flexibility', he added. GATE is an all India examination that primarily tests the comprehensive understanding of various undergraduate subjects in Engineering and Technology. The GATE score of a candidate reflects a relative performance of a candidate. The score is used for admissions to PG Engineering programmes (M.E., M.Tech., direct Ph.D.) in Indian Higher Education Institutes with financial assistance provided by MHRD and other Government Agencies. The score is also used by Public Sector units for employment screening purposes.
