Event Description

On August 13, 2016, a lecture on "Bioremediation techniques" was organized by Institute of Biomedical Education & Research. Faculty and students from all department of University participated in this workshop. Purpose of this workshop was to bring academicians and students on a single platform to get knowledge about Remediation of polluted sites using microbial process (bioremediation) that has proven effective and reliable due to its eco-friendly features. Bioremediation can either be carried out ex situ or in situ, depending on several factors, which include but not limited to cost, site characteristics, type and concentration of pollutants.

Dr. Gaurav Mudgal told aboutex situ bioremediation techniques. He told that these techniques involve excavating pollutants from polluted sites and subsequently transporting them to another site for treatment. Ex situ bioremediation techniques are usually considered based on: the cost of treatment, depth of pollution, type of pollutant, degree of pollution, geographical location and geology of the polluted site. Performance criteria, which also determine the choice of ex situ bioremediation techniques,

He told explained the In situ bioremediation techniques. He told that these techniques involve treating polluted substances at the site of pollution. It does not require any excavation; therefore, it is accompanied by little or no disturbance to soil structure. Ideally, these techniques ought to be less expensive compared to ex situ bioremediation techniques, due to no extra cost required for excavation processes; nonetheless, cost of design and on-site installation of some sophisticated equipment to improve microbial activities during bioremediation is of major concern. Some in situ bioremediation techniques might be enhanced (bioventing, biosparging

and phytoremediation), while others might proceed without any form of enhancement (intrinsic bioremediation or natural attenuation). In situ bioremediation techniques have been successfully used to treat chlorinated solvents, dyes, heavy metals, and hydrocarbons polluted sites.

He further concluded that the foremost step to a successful bioremediation is site characterization, which helps establish the most suitable and feasible bioremediation technique (ex situ or in situ). Ex situ bioremediation techniques tend to be more expensive due to additional costs attributed to excavation and transportation. Nonetheless, they can be used to treat wide range of pollutants in a controlled manner. In contrast, in situ techniques have no additional cost attributed to excavation; however, cost of on-site installation of equipment, coupled with inability to effectively visualize and control the subsurface of polluted site may render some in situ bioremediation techniques inefficient. Consequently, cost of remediation apparently is not the major factor that should determine the bioremediation technique to be applied to any polluted site.

In the last of the session, coordinator Mr. Mohit Kamthania thanked all participants for their kind support.

The event plans to artificial intelligence is a theory and development of computer systems that can perform tasks that normally require human intelligence. Speech recognition, decision-making, visual perception for example is features of human intelligence that artificial intelligence may possess.

Mr. Love Mittal said that, Artificial intelligence (AI) technologies have become globally recognized as indispensible tools for improving organizational efficiency and productivity. Suffice therefore to say that AI technologies have strongly influenced the world of work in the 21st century. In the library setting, the adoption of AI can improve library services and provides access to accurate information that can drive growth and development in this information age. Artificial intelligence technologies are now being used in libraries to achieve the organic integration of readers and libraries. With this, readers interact on the same platform, track and

acquire the personalized needs and information of users so that users can access accurate, all rounds, and humanized services, at a reduced cost to rationally utilize library resources.

He also spoke on the development of AI technologies is currently becoming commercialized. AI development platforms are now available from major software providers such as Google, Amazon, and Microsoft as well as hundreds of other niche and generalized companies, including companies focused solely on the transportation management market. Each of the major technology providers continue to improve the capabilities of their suite of software modules for AI to make the development of applications easier and more accessible to users without deep and extensive expertise in machine learning.

He also explained the various types of AI technologies could be used to help infrastructure owner-operators (IOO) for transportation systems management and operations (TSMO). For example, neural networks may help agencies improve incident detection time and identify anomalous activity, such as pedestrians or debris on a freeway; fuzzy logic may simplify the configuration of ramp metering systems; natural language question-and-answering systems may expand the abilities of TSMO staff to quickly obtain information from databases of facts and figures; and unmanned aerial systems (UAS), both on the ground and in the air, will likely augment human workers in a variety of ways. The selection of AI technologies is dependent on the particular problem at hand.Procurement of AI applications is currently a complex undertaking, which may range from purchasing a software package from a vendor to developing in-house applications using cooperative University resources for research and development.

He first employed the non-violent approach in South Africa where he was serving as an expatriate lawyer. Syed Ahmad Ali talk about the different national movements lead by Gandhi Ji like Satyagrah movement, Khilafat Movement, The Non-Cooperation Movement etc. One of his major achievements is in the year 1918 were the Champaran and Kheda agitations which are also called a movement against British landlords while Khilafat Movement is all about the worldwide protest against the status of Caliph by Muslims. The first of the Gandhi-led movements was the Non-Cooperation Movement lasting from September 1920 until February 1922.

The abrupt ending of the Non-Cooperation Movement did nothing to stop the quest for independence. On March 12, 1930, protesters took part in the Dandi March, a campaign designed to resist taxes and protest the British monopoly on salt. Gandhi began the 24-day, 240-mile march with 79 followers and ended with thousands. The Quit India Movement began on August 8, 1942, during World War II. The India Congress Committee, under the urging of Gandhi, called for a mass British withdrawal and Gandhi made a "Do or Die" speech.







The term comes from the Sanskrit, sitali, meaning "cooling" or "soothing"; prana, meaning "life force"; and ayama, meaning "extension." To practice sitali pranayama, the tongue is rolled and then the breath is drawn in through the tongue as if through a straw. This simple yet effective asana was demonstrated and the students followed the instruction.

There are several benefits of engaging in the activity. The students will be able to regulate the body temperature and still the mind after asana practice. It is particularly useful in hot weather. Sitali pranayama is also recommended by practitioners of the traditional Indian medicine of Ayurveda as a treatment for a *pitta dosha* imbalance. The pitta dosha is the body bio-element that controls metabolism, energy production and digestion. Because of its cooling effect, sitali pranayama is believed to benefit the nervous system and endocrine glands.


